Some Starter Stuff on Philippians

- 2nd Missionary Journey - Paul's redirection due to the Macedonian Vision Acts 16:6-12
- Paul and Silas' miracle release from prison and the Jailer Acts 16:16-40
- A brief 3rd Missionary Journey mention Acts 20:1-6
- Written during Paul's Roman imprisonment, AD 61 or 62
- The letter to the Philippians was delivered by Epaphroditus who had come to Rome with financial support for Paul from the church at Philippi. While in Rome, Epaphroditus became ill, delaying his return and delivery of the letter (2:26-27).
- Paul did not write Philippians in response to a crisis, as he did with Galatians and Colossians. He wrote this letter to express his affection and appreciate for the Philippian believers.
- Paul's love for them is clear and he encourages them to live out their faith in joy and unity.
