The Issue in Question

- Did Abraham love the gift of God (Isaac) or God himself?
- Do I assign more worth to my child (my possessions, positions, dreams) than I do to my God?

"We will worship and we will come back to you." Genesis 22:4-5; Hebrews 11:17-19 Three reasons Abraham knew this to be true

- 1. Isaac was the vehicle of God's promise therefore he must live
- God keeps His promises
- 3. God's power is absolute even over death (trusting in a resurrection if necessary)

A Model of a Father's Faith

Genesis 22:6-14

- When God does a transforming work in you, He isn't testing others, He's testing you.
- God will provide for Himself. He will work out the details He didn't give to us. Our responsibility is to trust Him.
- Some people live so carefully they refuse to take risks and practice a confident faith
- Isaac trusts his father and allows himself to be bound and placed on the altar.

Moriah - The Place Where We Learn to Hold Things Loosely

- God the Father showed us how to live when He release His Son to die for us.
- God the Son showed us how to die when he released Himself to the Father.
- 3. God the Holy Spirit shows us how to live as we learn how to release whatever has us in its grip.
