Luke 22:19; 1 Cor 11:25

The Words of Institution are those established by Jesus.

And he took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, “This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me.” In the same way, after the supper he took the cup, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you. Luke 22:19-20

We take Jesus’ words in their simple meaning, just as they read, and trust that Christ, who has made the promise, is able also to fulfill it.

The Lord’s Supper is God’s work by which he offers the grace and merits of Christ to all believers who, while saved, live in the reality of lives still plagued by sin. Through Him our sins are forgiven and our faith is strengthened.

What is present in the Bread and Wine?

- When we receive the Lord’s Supper we receive Christ’s true body and blood, in, with, and under the bread and wine.
- While the bread and wine are received in the natural manner of eating and drinking, the body and blood of our Lord are received in a supernatural, incomprehensible manner.
